Your child's Flu vaccine is due



FLU: 5 REASONS TO GET PROTECTED AGAINST FLU

The children learnt that William the Conqueror who became King of England in 1066 wanted a

huge fortress in London. He ordered the construction of an enormous stone tower beside the River Thames known today as the White Tower. This part of the Tower of London is known as the keep and it is visited by millions of visitors every year who want to see the greatest treasures - the Crown Jewels. The children discovered that the Crown Jewels has the largest clear-cut diamond in world. It is called the Cullinan I or the Great Star of Africa.

Thanks to so many votes Marchwood C of E Infant School achieved second place for their entry of a castle. Well, done!

When everyone had finished their model, the best one was voted for and a photo was uploaded to the competition page of the Kids With Bricks website.
